<p>Four objects in diamond shaped formation were observed from the ground at 1050 MST on 8 June 1952 by Mr and Mrs John D. Markland of 1200 South Princeton Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. Observation was made from the Monte Vista church, which is located approximately in the center of the city. The objects appeared to be of a flat-round shape, and of a very brilliant, whitish silver color. The size of the objects was indeterminable, but the observers said they were at approximately 15,000 feet altitude and traveling at approximately 300 MPH. No sound was audible nor did they leave any sort of trail. Location of the objects at first observation was approximately 60 degrees above the horizon to the north. Direction of travel was to the southwest or approximately on an angle of 240 degrees. There were a few cumulus clouds in all quadrants with visibility of 60 miles, and westerly winds of 10 MPH.</p>
